Title of Bill: Animal Cruelty and Abuse and Act

1 Be It Enacted By The American Legion Auxiliary New Mexico Girls State 2016 2 Section I. Body: In An end to Animal Cruelty would be the beginning of peace within the 3 citizens and animal in the state. Citizens can benefit from the use and help of animals. The state is known for its unique farming techniques. Many animals are a huge part of 4 the beautiful farming traditions. 5 the state of New Mexico animal abuse is considered a misdemeanor with a fine up to \$1000 and/or up to a year in prison. A fourth degree felony for animal abuse is a fine up to \$5000 and/or up to 18 months 6 in prison. This is an issue because animals don't have a voice when 7 sentencing happens. Many animals that are abused can not function in a normal loving home and can be aggressive toward other animals or their new owners. 8 Many abused animals cannot find new homes because of how aggressive they are 9 those animals are normally put down. These animals' lives are taken from them due to the fact that the animal could not do anything to prevent what 10 was happening. 11 Section II. Definitions: 12 - as used in "Animal Abuse Act" 13 a) Animal abuse: as an act that produces harm to an animal. The act is not in self defense or for survival. 14 b) Misdemeanor: a minor wrongdoing 15 c) Felony: a more serious crime that involves the punishment of prison time or death 16 17 Section III. Penalty: the punishment for animal abuse should be changed from a misdemeanor to a felony. 18 19 Section IV. Repeal: All laws, acts, provisions, or parts of laws contained in the Constitution of the State of New Mexico in conflict with any provision of 20 this act are herby repealed. 21 Section V. Effective Date: This act shall become effective immediately upon 22 its passage and approval by the American Legion Auxiliary New Mexico Girls State Governor or its otherwise becoming a law.
